Patient Information for MRI scheduling and follow up

1. What is an MRI?

- MRI (magnetic resonance imaging) is a diagnostic imaging technique that takes high resolution pictures of your bones and soft tissue.
- The study will generally take 30-90 minutes to complete.
- MRI uses a magnetic field instead of the radiation used in a regular x-ray. Because of this, please let your doctor know if you have any of the following in your body:
 - Implants
 - Metal clips
 - Metal objects
- The MRI machine can be very confining, so inform your provider of any issues with claustrophobia (fear of confined spaces).

2. How do I get my MRI?

- We have requested authorization from your insurance provider, and we will inform you if the request is approved or denied. We can also let you know what the estimated out-of-pocket cost will be (how much you will have to pay).
- Once the request is approved, the order will be sent to the imaging department you have requested.
 - You should receive a call to schedule an appointment in the next few days.

3. What happens after I have my MRI?

- Once you have had your MRI, please call the clinic to schedule a follow up appointment with your doctor to review the results.
